Visit to HMP Thorn Cross Alan Pierce-Jones	All curates

Thorn Cross is a category D open prison in the Village of Appleton Thorn on the outskirts of Warrington. It houses approx 420 adult men, convicted of various offences, but not terrorist nor sexual offences. People in Category D prisons are toward the end of their custodial sentence and can have employment outside of the prison or be temporary released for family and resettlement purposes. During the visit curates will get to learn about the role of chaplaincy within the justice system (both closed and open prisons). They will get to meet serving prisoners, chaplaincy and other staff and visit different parts of the prison. Please note the following: • Visitors should arrive at the prison by 10:00 hrs and report to the main gate building. • Photographic ID <u>must</u> be brought - people without ID will not be admitted. • There is a car park, but sharing of transport is advisable as it can get very full.	

- Visitors should bring nothing into the prison except their car key, ID and any essential medication they need while in the prison.
- In particular please note that it is a criminal offence to have a mobile phone in a prison, also smart watches, USB sticks, bladed items, tools etc are not allowed.
- If anyone needs to have any opiate based or prescription medicine with them, please inform Canon Alan Pierce-Jones in advance.

This year, we welcome Revd Timothy Goode, who is Canon for Congregational Discipleship and Nurture at York Minster. Prior to his move to York, the whole of his ordained ministry was spent within the Diocese of Southwark, serving at Croydon Minster in Whyteleafe, Chaldon and finally at Rector at St Margaret's Lee. He was made an honorary canon of Southwark Cathedral in 2020 and was Disability Advisor for the Southwark Diocese from 2013-2021. A theologian, priest, and writer, Tim's work focuses on disability theology, Christian anthropology, and the transformation of ecclesial life, worship, and heritage. Having lived with disability for over thirty years, Tim brings lived experience into sustained theological engagement with ableism in the Church, particularly as it has been shaped by post-Constantinian assumptions about power, perfection, and the idealised body.
